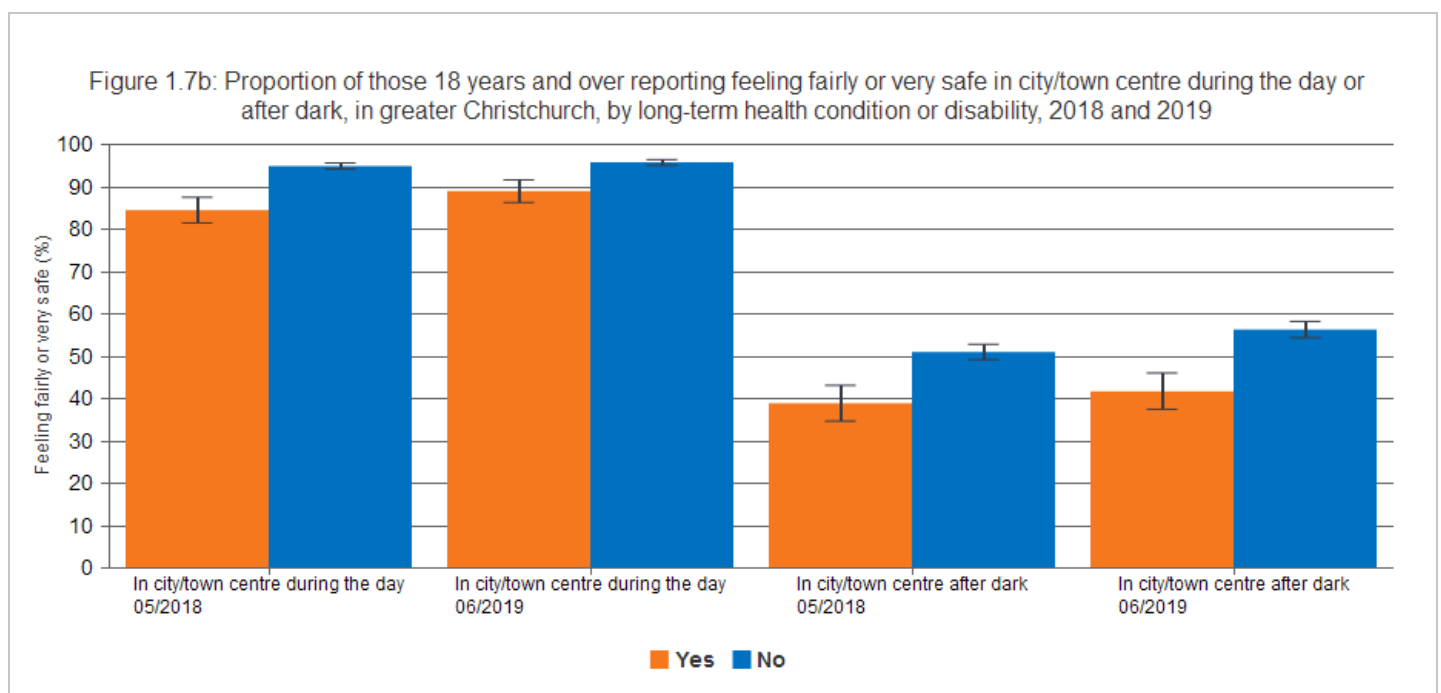
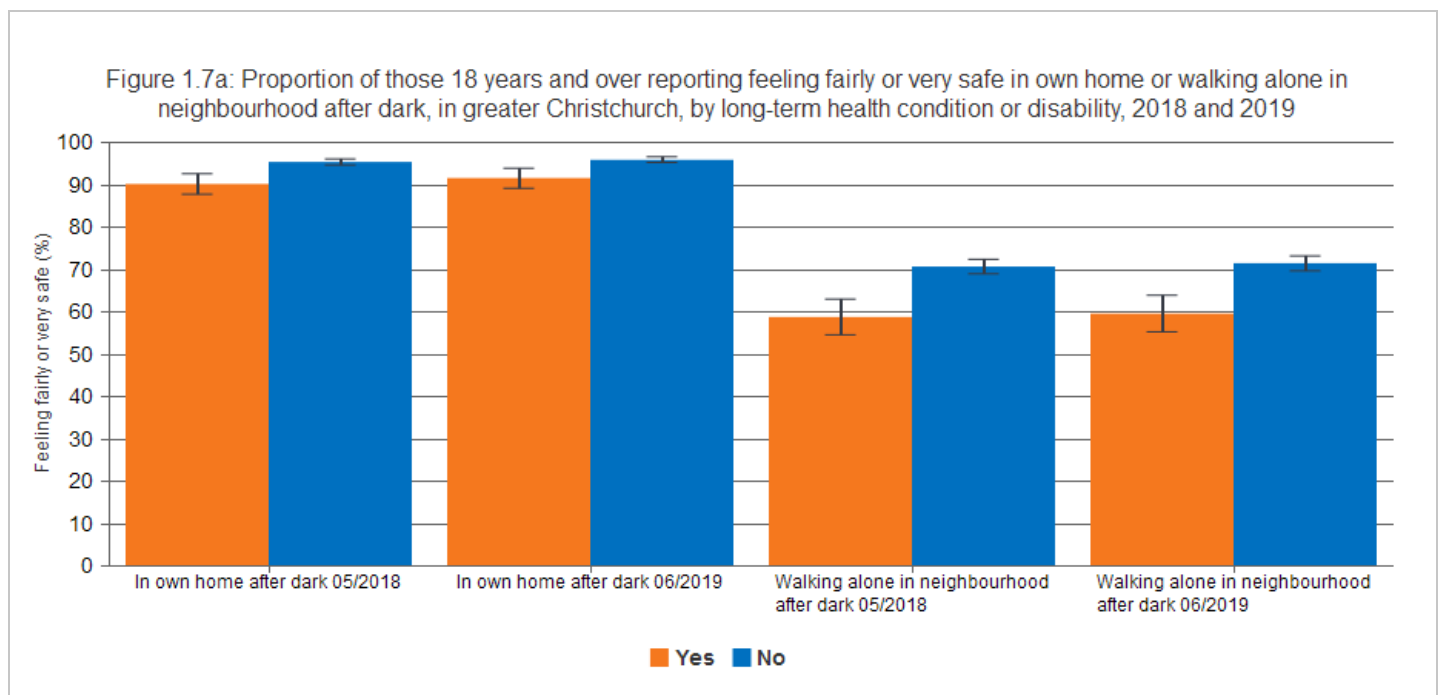


Perceptions of safety: Breakdown by disability

The figures show that in all four situations respondents with a long-term health condition or disability had statistically significantly

lower levels of perceived safety, compared with respondents without a long-term health condition or disability (averaging about 10 percentage points difference across the categories).
